Research

There are an estimated 11 million people in the United States and 288 million people worldwide affected by some form of macular degeneration. These number are projected to double by 2050.

Despite progress, much more research is needed to understand macular degeneration and to find a cure. Our latest research project, conducted in multiple clinic centers across the United States, is focused on genetic treatments and medications aimed at offering HOPE to those living with this condition.

In 2024, MDA invested \$50,000 into AMD research, with plans to allocate at least \$100,000 for research in 2025.

Education

People living with AMD and their families often feel frustrated when searching for reliable, understandable information and meaningful resources to navigate this life-changing vision disease.

Every year, 19.83 million people worldwide are diagnosed with some form of macular degeneration.

Our updated website serves as a valuable resource, providing people with the information and tools they need to better understand and cope.

Through nationwide educational programs, videos, newsletters, etc. we reached 241,658 people in 2024, offering hope and vital information to those living with macular degeneration and vision loss.
